### Section B: Diversion Guidelines

#### **B.13) Diversion Credit for Dirt/Soil**

Franchisees and self-haul facilities do not receive diversion credit for reuse or recycling of source-separated loads of dirt/soil, and this restriction also applies to trades of diversion credit. Source-separated soil/dirt does not count toward either diversion or disposal in franchisee and self-haul facility quarterly reports of diversion.

Franchisees and self-haul facilities may claim diversion credit for dirt/soil only in the following circumstances:

- 1) If individual loads of mixed construction and demolition debris or mixed inerts (concrete, asphalt, etc.) are sorted/processed and the resulting soil is used for beneficial reuse (landfill cover, onsite landfill construction, fill for construction projects, etc); or
- 2) If residual soil/dirt resulting from processing mixed recyclables is used for beneficial reuse (alternative daily cover, onsite landfill construction, etc).
